Veterinary nurse appointments and Puppy parties

The Vale Veterinary Group have a great team of nurses who can help you and your pet with preventative health care and advise on a range of healthcare problems. Many of these services can be provided free of charge or at a reduced cost



Free Veterinary Nurse appointments

<u>Post op checks</u> These are usually carried out 3 & 10 days after surgery, to ensure good healing and recovery.

<u>Suture removal</u> Most stitches are removed 10 –14 days after surgery.

Nutrition advice Discuss the best diet for your pet. Our nurses can advise you on the healthiest choice for weight control and on age related nutrition. Your pet will be weighed and advise is available on diet and ideal weight. They will invite you back for check ups at regular intervals to check on your pets progress.

<u>Juvenile health checks</u> Bring your young pet along to have your pet weighed and discuss any concerns you may have. The nurses can answer any questions you may have about neutering, the procedure and after care.

<u>Dental checks</u> Ask a nurse to check your pets teeth. They can give advice on caring for your pet's teeth, or advise if dental surgery may be needed.

'Creaky Clinic' Senior pet checks for dogs & cats

If you have a senior pet (over the age of 9), then a nurse can advise you on topics such as weight, dental care, arthritis, diet and blood pressure. You will be asked to bring a fresh urine sample in which will be analysed for you free of charge.

Rabbit checks Rabbits can suffer from a range of ailments, such as overgrown teeth, matted fur, skin or eye problems, mucky bottom, obesity and fly strike. A nurse can give your rabbit a general health check and discuss



how to avoid these problems. They can also discuss preventative health care such as vaccination & worming.

6 month post neuter checks (dogs) Following neutering some dogs can gain weight. This will happen over a period of time, so may go unnoticed. A nurse will weigh your pet and discuss choosing a suitable diet. If necessary you may then be invited back for a follow up check to see how your pet is progressing.

Administering medication The nurses can administer a range of medication. For example, a worming tablet to your cat or some of the injections of Cartrophen. You just pay for the cost of the medication.

Please note that if you are referred to a Veterinary Surgeon and further tests and medication required, then a fee will be charged.



Chargeable Veterinary Nurse appointments

<u>Dressing changes</u> Nurses can change your pet's dressings/bandages. They will assess the wound and it's healing progress. There will be a charge for their time and the cost of the dressings.

<u>Blood samples</u> A nurse can take blood Samples if a test is requested by a Veterinary Surgeon.

<u>Blood pressure</u> Some pets need to have their blood pressure monitored. A nurse can do this for you.

Nail clipping Nurses will clip nails for your dog, cat as well as rabbits, hamsters and guinea pigs.

<u>Apply flea treatment</u> Some pets just don't like having flea treatments applied.

The nurses are happy to apply this for you, or show you how to do it. The charge is for the flea medication only.

Micro-chipping The nurses can micro chip your pet. This is a simple procedure that takes just a few minutes. We recommend having your pet micro-chipped so that you can be reunited as soon as possible should they go missing.
